The purposes of the Congress are to stimulate corporate awareness and interest in risk-related research and to provide a forum for networking among academics and industry and government professionals worldwide. Congress is open to "all persons" who share an interest in promoting education and research in the broad areas of risk and insurance. Except for their interest in the conference, preferably in the form of presenting a paper, no criteria are established for participant qualifications. APRIA graciously hosts the Second Congress to be held in Singapore in 2010.

Scientific Committees of the Congress invite submission of proposals to present theoretical or applied research dealing with issues in risk management, insurance, actuarial science, and related areas.

1 February 2010 – Proposal Submission Deadline
1 June 2010 – Full Paper Submission Deadline

Proposal Submission. The proposal must be submitted only to a single regional committee (APRIA, ARIA or EGRIE) of the author's choice, preferably the one with which the author has the greatest affinity. Multiple submission of the same paper is not permitted. The proposal must be in English. Each proposal should be in **two separate files**: (1) one containing the author and full contact information plus paper title and abstract only; and (2) the other containing no author information but with the paper title and a detailed proposal (i.e., the purpose and importance of the research, methodology and data, expected results, and references). A full paper in lieu of proposal is encouraged. The submission should be made via:

Final Paper Submission. The Scientific Committees will review all submissions using a double-blind approach or equivalent. The committees' decision is final and is expected to be made on or around **1 April 2010**. Selected authors must submit electronically their full papers by **1 June 2010**.

Awards for Junior Scholars and Best Papers. The World Congress provides limited financial aid to selected junior authors from developing economies whose papers are selected for the program. Platinum and gold sponsors of the Congress have made available these awards. APRIA, ARIA and EGRIE also offer numerous awards for best papers.
