The 2nd CC+I Seminar will focus on the Insurance Industry and Climate Change in Latin America and the Caribbean (LAC)

Climate Change brings new risks but also new opportunities for the insurance sector. Most of the present research and publications are euro-centred, but the impact of Climate Change on the LAC region could be severe and disproportionate with regard to its pro capita greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions.

- Climate change is happening and calls for mitigation and adaptation measures. These differ according to countries' degree of economic development.
- LAC is characterised by a high vulnerability of its population with regard to CC (see proceedings of the M.O.R.E. 23 / 1st CC+I Seminar, organised jointly with Suramericana de Seguros and held 19-20 October 2009 in Bogotá). The contributions of the insurance industry to help mitigating these impacts are unclear, as well as the scope for joint initiatives with political authorities and other economic actors.

The insurance industry is forward-looking by nature, and has a long-term comprehensive approach shared by few other economic actors. It thus has a strong interest to understand the impacts of, and shifts due to, climate change.

Conditions for participation

Participation at the CC+I - Seminars is

- free of charge, but any person interested in attending should register in advance and will receive a confirmation of participation.

Rules of the CC+I - Seminars

In order to foster discussions between speakers and participants:

- attendance is limited to 50 participants on a first-come, first-served basis;
- presentations are limited to 20 minutes, followed by 20 minutes of discussion;
- the working language of the seminar is English.

Selected papers will be submitted to the editors of *The Geneva Papers on Risk and Insurance-Issues and Practice*, a refereed journal, to be considered for publication.

The Risk Management Programme is an integral part of The Geneva Association's dialogue with other economic actors in order to emphasize the role of insurance in a modern service economy. The focus of the programme is to:

- provide a platform between the insurance community, the engineering and academic communities and policy-makers to discuss risk issues;
- foster the use of risk assessment and risk management tools in new fields of application, such as policy-making;
- promote the insurability-of-risks concept as the 'natural' borderline between State legislation and the market economy;
- identify new opportunities for insurers in the emerging sustainability concept in order to enlarge the field of insurable risks;
- research and illustrate the new risks in the emerging service economy, based on an extended performance responsibility of economic actors.
